Procedure: Checking and Topping Off Engine Oil

5. Top-off: Use only oil meeting VW 508 00 / 509 00 standards. Do not overfill, as this can damage the catalytic converter.

Procedure: Tyre Pressure Monitoring System (TPMS) Calibration

The Audi A3 uses an **indirect TPMS**, which relies on the ABS wheel speed sensors to detect a change in tyre diameter (caused by pressure loss) rather than internal pressure sensors.

- Adjust all tyres to the pressures listed on the B-pillar sticker.
- Turn on the ignition.
- Select Vehicle > Settings & Service > Tyre Pressure Loss Indicator > Store Tyre Pressures.
- Confirm the selection. The system will now use the current rotational frequency as the baseline.

Troubleshooting and Case Studies
