4. System Re-engagement: Use the diagnostic tool to "End Lining Replacement," which moves the pistons back to the contact point.
5. Thickness Adaptation: Input the new pad thickness (e.g., 12mm) into the controller to ensure the wear sensor logic is reset.

Advanced Diagnostic Procedures and Mathematical Modeling

The Audi A8 service manuals often incorporate mathematical constants for sensor calibration. For instance, the **Long-Term Fuel Trim (LTFT)** and **Short-Term Fuel Trim (STFT)** analysis require understanding the stoichiometric ratio (14.7:1 for gasoline) and how the ECU compensates for air leaks.
