

The Science of High-Fiber Detoxification: A Technical Analysis of the 10-Day Green Smoothie Cleanse

Technical Analysis of Core Ingredients

Mathematical Modeling of Weight Loss and Energy Balance

The claim of losing "15 lbs in 10 days" requires a mathematical breakdown of caloric expenditure versus intake.
