- 4. Quality Assurance (QA): Before an episode goes live (at the standard 5:00 AM PST/6:00 AM PDT release time), it must be checked for rendering errors, broken links, or incorrectly triggered coin gates.

Economic Implications for the Modern Artist

Lezhin's model represents a shift from the "starving artist" trope to a structured, data-driven career.
